

NATIONAL CONFERENCE ON 21ST CENTURY PEDAGOGY: SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

April 27th, 2023

1. PRELUDE

The new demands of the rapidly changing world of education have posed both pressure and aspiration on the stakeholders in EFL classrooms to reshape the educational roadmap that aims to embrace the innovations in many pedagogical areas. Despite the efforts made by practitioners in the field, more work is still needed to meet the needs of the twenty-first-century learners worldwide. In Algeria, the successive educational reforms since the independence in both tertiary and pre-tertiary levels, namely the LMD system in the university and the competency-based approach in pre-tertiary levels have partially achieved the desired goals of establishing a modern classroom with local and global facets especially in the era of technological proliferation. The evidence is that many pupils are unable to generate and develop their Higher- Order Thinking skills (HOTs) that go beyond memorization and recalling of information to include application, analysis, synthesis, and evaluation in addition to critical thinking and problem solving (Bookhart, 2010). In tertiary education, the adopted LMD system that aimed principally to engage learners in more globalization and mobility-driven programs has shown some dysfunctions especially in providing learners with necessary skills that prepare them for the future professional/ vocational life and help them develop the 21st-century skills linked to the demands of the global socioeconomic market (Idri 2005, Kies 2016, Mami 2013).

21st century pedagogy aims to develop not only the skills needed for school, but also the skills needed for work and citizenship (Ryymin, 2017) by focusing on several core components of modern learning: metacognition (reflection), critical thinking, technology, and problem and projectbased learning. 2. CONFERENCE THEME

Algerian 21st century learners of English aspire for a schooling atmosphere that takes place in both physical and virtual spaces that "reflect a bold and creative commitment to relevance and quality learning and teaching" (Whitby, 2005: 2). Therefore, different voices are constantly and insistently calling for an instant shift from conventional classroom to a more hybrid classroom that approves premises of both synchronous and asynchronous learning seeking to meet the needs of the new generation of learners with paradoxical prerequisites and divergent learning styles that reflect their social and emotional states. In an attempt to cope with this dilemmatic scenario, the 21st-century pedagogy seeks to embrace personalized learning and empower intrapersonal, interpersonal, and cognitive abilities of learners in a complex, multidisciplinary and knowledgedriven economy (Trilling and Fadel 2009, in Kai Wah Chu et al., 2017: 8).

3. OBJECTIVES

This national conference aims to:

1. stimulate a serious academic debate about the new trends in ELT that target the 21st century pedagogy, namely the High Order Thinking skills (HOTs) and Social Emotional Learning (SEL).

2. present theories and discuss practices about the smart pedagogyled classroom that builds an individual who supports the ideals of the local and global community that believes in the merits of digital literacies and life and career skills.

3. suggest ideas that encourage social emotional learning, problem-solving, critical thinking, and educational partnership within a data-rich and media-driven instructional medium.

4. make significant contributions in the literature embracing EFL pedagogy which complies with the socioeconomic demands of the nation by shifting from insular knowledge to a more connective one (Mortimore, 1999) encompassing cross-cutting skills that span across disciplines.
